Sending Nudes





'Sending nudes' refers to the sending of explicit photos through social media apps or text message

According to a recent survey (2022), almost half of Irish students between 15 and 18 years of age have been asked to send nudes.

Teenagers may do this as a way of sexually expressing themselves or they may feel pressured to do so, either by one person or their social circle.

- It's a risky activity because the receiver may decide to share the pictures.
- 'Sexting' and 'self-generated images' are other terms used to describe this activity.
- If you're worried that your child may be sending nudes, address the issue in a frank conversation. Don't judge them. Instead, let your child know you are concerned about them and that you're always there for them, no matter what.

- It is illegal to send or distribute explicit content of a person under the age of 18.
- Image-based abuse and/or cases of suspected child sexual abuse material can be reported to Hotline.ie and/or An Garda Síochána. Make sure to take a screenshot of the offensive image and note the URL of where you came across it.

Let your child know you are concerned about them and that you're always there for them, no matter what.
