Our organisation is committed to protecting children and young people from both traditional forms of bullying and cyberbullying from the perspective of young people.

Existing research is predominantly quantitative in nature and young people's voices are largely absent from the current discourse. The omission of young people's perspectives may lead to a misinterpretation of their needs and misguided prevention and intervention strategies. It has been suggested that collaborating with children and children and young people as co-researchers could enhance efforts to understand and address cyberbullying.
