No concern or worry is too small or too big to reach out for




Why We Need Your Help

Our Services

Childline Listening

Childline is Ireland's 24-hour national listening service for all children and young people (up to and including the age of 18) in Ireland. It is private, confidential and non-judgemental and can be contacted for free from anywhere in Ireland.

Childline can be contacted by any child or young person by calling 1800 66 66 66 or chatting online at Childline.ie 24 hours a day, every day.

Missing Children's Hotline

The ISPCC's Missing Children's Hotline provides emotional support and advice to young people and adults alike in relation to missing children.

The Hotline can be contacted for free 24 hours a day, every day, by calling 116 000.

The service is available to take calls from the general public, family members of a missing child and children who are missing.

ISPCC Support Line

The ISPCC Support Line provides a listening service, offering information, advice and emotional support to members of the public who contact us on any issue in relation to child protection and welfare.

Smart Moves

Smart Moves is a suite of evidencebased short sessions, led by teachers to give young people small, learnable skills ("Smart Moves") that increase resilience.

The programme aims to support the emotional resilience of children as they prepare to transition from primary to secondary school. The Smart Moves programme also has a secondary school programme which supports young people as they begin their journey in secondary school or as they transition into their new secondary school.

The Shield programme aims to support organisations in their efforts to proactively manage bullying and protect children and young people from bullying through prevention and intervention strategies.


We encourage organisations to work through the **Shield Self-Evaluation Tool** and to receive upon review **Shield Status** for their organisation.

 parents, teachers and students.

- Your donations will automatically be sent to Childline from the fundraising page.
 These donations will support our 24hr listening service.
- After you've finished, your Conga Line for Childline your school will receive a certificate
