Why We Need Your Help

Each year, up to **70%** of our funding needs to be raised from donations. We need to continually fundraise to provide our suite of services and supports.

To ensure our 24hr support line is available 24/7, 365 days, **€12,000 is needed each day.**

Alongside our FREE 24hr support line, we provide **Childline Therapeutic Supports, Digital Mental Health and Wellbeing programmes** for children and young people experiencing low to moderate anxiety, and a **library of self-help resources and topical information on [childline.ie](https://www.childline.ie)**

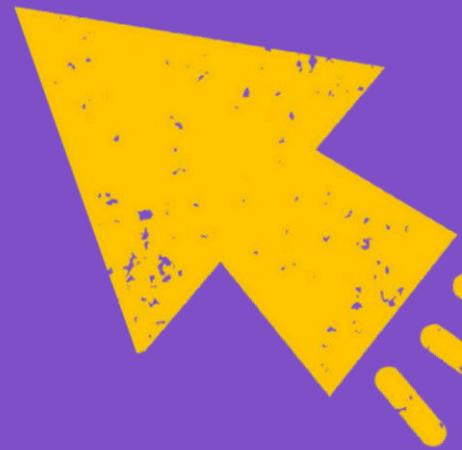

Our Services

Childline Listening

Childline is Ireland's 24-hour national listening service for all children and young people (up to and including the age of 18) in Ireland. It is private, confidential and non-judgemental and can be contacted for free from anywhere in Ireland.

Childline can be contacted by any child or young person by calling 1800 66 66 66 or chatting online at Childline.ie 24 hours a day, every day.

Missing Children's Hotline

The ISPCC's Missing Children's Hotline provides emotional support and advice to young people and adults alike in relation to missing children.

The Hotline can be contacted for free 24 hours a day, every day, by calling 116 000.

The service is available to take calls from the general public, family members of a missing child and children who are missing.

ISPCC Support Line

The ISPCC Support Line provides a listening service, offering information, advice and emotional support to members of the public who contact us on any issue in relation to child protection and welfare.

Smart Moves

Smart Moves is a suite of evidence-based short sessions, led by teachers to give young people small, learnable skills ("Smart Moves") that increase resilience.

The programme aims to support the emotional resilience of children as they prepare to transition from primary to secondary school. The Smart Moves programme also has a secondary school programme which supports young people as they begin their journey in secondary school or as they transition into their new secondary school.

Digital Mental Health and Wellbeing

We offer digital programmes aimed at reducing anxiety for children and young people, as well as digital programmes for parents and carers around managing their own anxiety while supporting their anxious child or teenager.

Youth Participation

The ISPCC believes that children and young people should have the opportunity to be fully involved in setting priorities, developing strategies, assessing progress in their communities, preparing for adversities and taking part in decisions which affect their lives.

In recent times, Children's Advisory Committee members have been involved in activities from providing guidance on the development of ISPCC Childline's new digital platform to taking part in inter-generational projects in their communities.

Shield

The Shield programme aims to support organisations in their efforts to proactively manage bullying and protect children and young people from bullying through prevention and intervention strategies.

We encourage organisations to work through the **Shield Self-Evaluation Tool** and to receive upon review **Shield Status** for their organisation.

Childline Therapeutic Support Services

Our Childline Therapeutic Support Service (CTSS) works with any young person up to 18 years of age.

The aim of the service is to build resilience and increase the young person's coping skills. We can meet children and young people at a place where they are most comfortable, which could be online, in your home, a local community centre or their school.

Sometimes sharing your worries and chatting with a friend can help us feel better so why not take on the challenge this Spring!



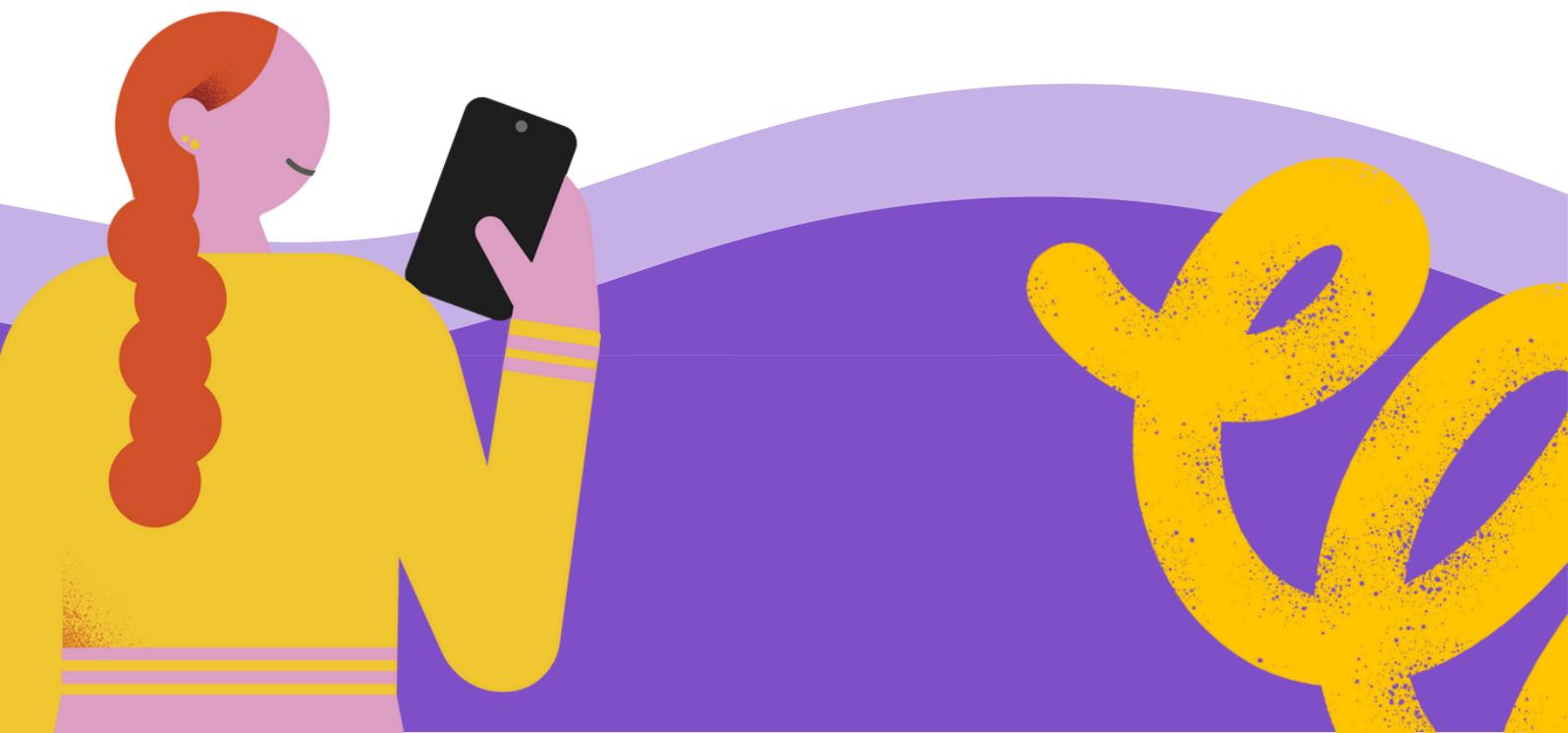

How Schools and Clubs Can Take Part

- Sign up your class or school by registering your fundraising page. Link to register: [Lap and Chat](#)
- Ask each student to donate €4 through your schools fundraising page to take part. This link can be easily sent to parents/guardians through emails, shared on your school website/socials or WhatsApp.
- Childline will be in touch after you've set up your fundraising page. We will provide your class with a virtual school talk, an information booklet on how Childline can support your students and teachers and an activity workbook for your students.
- Choose any date in March to host a lap and chat in your school. Inform parents, teachers and students.
- Partner up with a friend in your class or school and start your lap! During your lap, talk about what is on your mind or what might be worrying you.
- After your Lap and Chat, complete the reflection piece in your workbook to learn more about how talking about our worries can make us feel better.
- Your donations will automatically be sent to Childline from the fundraising page. These donations will support our 24hr phone and chat line.
- After you've finished, your school will receive a certificate of completion.
